## DISCUSSIONS

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

Jerry Haddix, Grants Coordinator, was present along with Dave Walling, Assistant Sanitary Engineer, for a work session to discuss residential the fees associated with the connection of residential properties to the new sanitary sewer constructed with CDBG funds relative to the expansion of Hartz Mountain in Harlan Township.

Mr. Haddix explained that the Health Department is reviewed the private sewage systems of the residents along the new sewer line and will determine which systems are failing and must be connected to the new sewer. He then stated that the CDBG rules stated that there can be no assessments associated with the project and that anyone who falls into the "low to moderate" income bracket cannot be charged a capacity fee relative to the project.

There was much discussion relative to the options available and upon further discussion, the Board stated their desire for Mr. Haddix to obtain a salary survey of the residents and report the findings upon completion for further discussion.

On motion, bids were closed at 9:15 a.m. this 11<sup>th</sup> day of October and the following bids were received, opened and read aloud for Hart Road Waterline Extension for the Warren County Water and Sewer Department:

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, will review bids for a recommendation at a later date.

Mike Yetter, Zoning Inspector, was present along with Stan Williams, Regional Planning Commission, and Bruce McGary, Assistant Prosecutor, to discuss the Warren County Rural Zoning Code Re-Write relative to the Sexually Orientated Business classification.

Mr. Yetter explained that there are two options on how the Board can handle this classification as follows:

- 1. Allow the use within a specific zoning classification which would require the matter to come before the Board as a site plan review application. This option keeps the matters within the Board's review but there is limited ability for the Board to deny the use if it is specified as allowable.
- 2. Allow the use as a "conditional use" within a specific zoning classification. This would require the applicant to come before the Zoning Board of Appeals which could determine if the proposed use is appropriate for the specific location. This option would put the decision into the hands of the Zoning Board of Appeals and the Board would not have a vote in the matter.

Upon further discussion, Mr. McGary stated he will let the Board know after the next few meetings which way the Rural Zoning Commission determines to proceed in the Zoning Rewrite.

There was also discussion relative to the Board's concurrence with the creation of a Park Zoning classification. The Board stated that even though there are many stipulations in place that would prevent the majority of the public owned parkland to be developed, if the creation of this classification gives the residence an additional level of assurance, they have no problem with it.

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board entered into executive session at 10:06 a.m. to discuss pending litigation with legal counsel pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22 (G)(3) and exited at 12:20 p.m.
