PUBLIC HEARING VACATION OF MABREY ROAD IN TURTLECREEK TOWNSHIP

The public hearing to consider the vacation of Mabrey Road in Turtlecreek Township was convened this 13th day of May 2014.

Commissioner South opened the public hearing by giving background information of the area and stated the Board has viewed the property and feels it is appropriate to vacate.

There was discussion relative to a barrier being placed on the vacated road right of way to allow only the farmers to utilize the paved area to access their fields. The Board requested Mr. Tunison to make the appropriate arrangements for the barrier.

Upon discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #14-737) to approve the vacation of Mabrey Road in Turtlecreek Township with the reservation of a utility easement.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, was present along with staff for a work session to discuss the following matters:

- 1. Mr. Brausch updated the Board on complaint calls his office has been receiving relative to restoration of property. He stated that these restorations are needed due to various breaks that occurred over the winter and that staff is actively working on yard repairs, weather permitting.
- 2. Chris Wojnicz, Assistant Sanitary Engineer, presented information relative to a subdivision constructed in the late 1990's (Village on the Green) that did not stub the waterline to their property line. He then stated that a new subdivision is being platted (Hawthorn Manor, Section 5) that is being required to stub the lines to the end of their property line but will be approximately 100' short of a loop due to the error in the review process of Village on the Green. Upon discussion, the Board approved the Water/Sewer Department to pay the cost of approximately \$15,000 \$20,000 to connect the waterlines and repave the road.
- 3. Deerfield Township Sewer Study—Bill Becker, Township Administrator, was present along with Lois McKnight, Development Director, to request the Board's consideration in hiring a consultant to conduct a sewer study of the area along Montgomery Road relative to available capacity for the two remaining parcels without sanitary sewer if /when Mendards locates next to the existing Meijer store. Ms. McKnight explained that they looking at the entire corridor rather than individual parcels and want to know if a mixed use that would include commercial with a secondary use of multifamily residential would be feasible.

Mr. Brausch stated that, as the property is zoned today, there is capacity in the pump station and lines to accommodate development. He then stated that if you change to any type of residential use, it would require additional capacity and a study would be required to determine how much capacity would be available.

Commissioner Young stated that he has 0% interest in encouraging apartments in this area. He stated that this Board does not control zoning for this area but they do control sanitary sewers. Mr. Young stated his opinion that if additional sewer capacity is required, his answer is no.

Mr. Becker requested the Board to consider performing a study to model uses and determine what upgrades will be required.

Commissioner South stated that if Warren County can provide sanitary sewer service as it is zoned today, it is not appropriate to expend taxpayers dollars on a study. She then stated that if Deerfield Township is convinced that a senior housing complex or low density housing is appropriation, then the developer should pick up the expense of the study.

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Mr. Becker explained that he is not requesting the County to make expensive upgrades, he is requesting the study to see what available capacity is as the system is designed today.

Commissioner Young stated his agreement with Commissioner South that Warren County will not pay for a study. He stated that if the developer would like to pay for the study, the answer may still be no in his opinion.

4. Union Township Proposed Development— Mr. Brausch stated that High Point Custom Homes has an option to purchase the Rapp Property (127 acres), located within the Kings School District. He stated that the preliminary plans are to construction high end homes on 1 or 2 acres lots and they have been working with the City of Lebanon on availability of sanitary sewer service. He then stated that the developer would be making a similar request as the Tordov property to amend the OKI Water Quality Map (209 Plan) to release this area to the City of Lebanon. He stated that this property is adjacent to the City of Lebanon sewers with access from Grant Drive.

The Board stated that prior to any amendment request to OKI, they would require a concept plan to be presented.

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board entered into executive session at 10:31 a.m. to discuss personnel matters relative to hiring within the Water and Sewer Department and discipline within Warren County Children Services pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22 (G)(1) and exited at 11:40 a.m.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.
