DISCUSSIONS

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, was present along with Jacque Brody, Business Manager, for a work session to discuss water and sanitary sewer rates for 2017, 2018 and 2019.

Mrs. Brody presented the attached PowerPoint presentation reviewing past rates, expense trends, revenue trends and the rates staff is proposing for 2017, 2018 and 2019.

Commissioner Grossmann questioned the potential transfer into surplus for year end 2016 versus the amount collected.

Mr. Brausch stated that staff is looking for direction on what their desire is relative to fees.

Commissioner Young reviewed the overwhelming support for water softening from the customers participating in the online survey.

There was discussion relative to the proposal to eliminate the \$2.50 flat fee for sanitary sewer capital improvement and replace it with a \$7.50 capital improvement fee to pay for the upgrades required associated with providing softened water.

There was discussion relative to the Oakwood Rate Survey which indicates that Warren County would still be one of the lowest rates in the area after a proposed increase.

Commissioner Grossmann stated his concern relative to charging a flat fee for an improvement before the customers are able to benefit from it.

Commissioner Young explained the philosophy of Warren County relative to how improvements are financed in Warren County and the ability finance \$20 million less of the improvements if this fee is collected in advance.

Upon discussion, Commissioner Grossmann stated his desire for additional time to consider the matter and the desire for Commissioner South to participate in this discussion.

Victoria VanHarlingen, Warren County Historical Society, was present along with Bill Duning, Board of Directors member, for a work session to discuss their current handicap accessibility project.

Mr. Duning presented the attached rendering showing the new ADA entrance addition along with the proposed site plan showing the shared parking proposed through the Library Parking Lot Development.

Mr. Duning stated that the State of Ohio is providing a capital fund grant for the project in the amount of \$190,000 with the possibility of an additional \$190,000 grant. He stated that the proposed project cost is \$655,000.

Ms. Van Harlingen stated that 17 years ago the Board provided a grant to the Historical Society that allowed for the creation of their conference center. She then reviewed the proposed addition concept and requested the Board provide a grant in the amount of \$210,000 towards the project.

Commissioner Young questioned the utilization of the facility and acknowledged that the Historical Society is following the direction of the Board relative to asking for financial contribution for specific projects versus the request for a significant contribution based upon population.

Commissioner Young explained to the Historical Society the Board's primary focus of public safety. He then explained the current situation with jail overcrowding and the need to construct a jail improvement estimated between \$30 and \$40 million.

Upon further discussion, the Board stated they would take the request under advisement.

PUBLIC HEARING

VACATION OF A PORTION OF OAK DRIVE IN DEERFIELD TOWNSHIP

The Board met this 15th day of November 2016, to consider the vacation of a portion of Oak Drive in Deerfield Township.

Neil Tunison, County Engineer, stated that he has reviewed the request for the right of way vacation and discussed the issue of a shed being constructed in the middle of the right of way.

Bruce McGary, Assistant Prosecutor, stated that this is a planned subdivision and an unimproved roadway. He stated that there is no fee simple interest and Warren County does not accept the roadway for public maintenance until such time as it has been constructed to standards. He stated that the shed is an issue that the private property owners need to resolve and should not be a matter for government. He stated that the Board must make a determination that this vacation is for the public convenience and welfare. He then discussed a new procedure for roadway vacation where the Township Trustees initiate the vacation.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #16-1807) to approve the vacation of a portion of Oak Drive in Deerfield Township reserving the right to construct, maintain, or remove any utilities within the road right-of-way as formerly dedicated to the public use.

PUBLIC HEARING

VACATION OF MAPLE AVENUE IN DEERFIELD TOWNSHIP

The Board met this 15th day of November 2016, to consider the request for the vacation of Maple Avenue in Deerfield Township.

Neil Tunison, County Engineer, stated that he does not have a problem with the approval of the vacation request.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #16-1808) to approve the vacation of Maple Avenue in Deerfield Township reserving the right to construct, maintain, or remove any utilities within the road right-of-way as formerly dedicated to the public use.

The Board adjourned into the conference room with Tiffany Zindel, County Administrator, and Tina Osborne, Clerk of Commissioners, for a work session to discuss the 2017 annual appropriations.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.





Dear Warren County Commissioners:

Last fall several members of the Board of Trustees of the Warren County Historical Society visited with you and talked briefly about our plans to develop ADA accessible entrances for both the Warren County History Center Museum and the Lebanon Conference & Banquet Center. The Lebanon Public Library was in the process of getting permission to raze six houses surrounding the History Center and Banquet Center, creating a new entrance for the Library and over 70 parking spaces, which they would share with the Warren County Historical Society. We think you would agree we would be doing our community a disservice if we did not take advantage of the new parking facilities to provide ADA accessible entrances to both our museum and conference facilities. Consequently the Warren County Historical Society applied to the State of Ohio for capital funds for an ADA accessibility project and received a \$190,000 grant. In addition, Representative Maag is working to secure and additional \$191,000, a total of \$381,000. The total cost of the project is \$655,000.

Why is this project important? Both the Warren County History Center and the Lebanon Conference & Banquet Center have proved their worth to the community time and again. How do we do that?

- As the owners of two museums and a nationally lauded historical research archive, our mission is to preserve and celebrate the heritage of Warren County and make our facilities accessible to school groups for the education of its children.
- We connect our citizens to their community and inspire civic pride in its accomplishments..
- As a heritage tourism organization we draw visitors from around the country who eat in our restaurants, stay in our hotels and motels, shop our specialty shops and generally spend money in Warren County. If we closed our doors tomorrow, Warren County would poorer by \$1.5 million per year.






