The undersigned hereby agrees to furnish, deliver, and install all equipment as provided in the specifications.

Fiber Installation for 313 Cook Rd Humane Association /Animal Shelter

Fiber Specifications

- 1. The contractor shall furnish and install a 24-strand single-mode fiber optical cable from the 500 Justice DR. building in the "Unit 2 room" in the designated rack space on Warren County Government Campus to the Humane Association MER. The fiber optic cable shall be suitable and carry the proper rating and protection for installation in an outdoor and/or underground conduit environment. The cable shall be loose tube and follow the industry-standard color code.
- 1. The contractor shall furnish and install a 24-strand fiber underground in orange innerduct from 500 Justice Dr Unit 2 frame room to 313 Cook Rd Humane Association MER.

Contractor shall provide and furnish a cable with the proper rating to be installed in an outdoor environment enclosed in a conduit. Simultaneously carrying the proper rating to be installed in a plenum environment. The cable shall have suitable protection from the manufacture to keep the cable protected underground enclosed in conduit and in an overhead tray with a variety of other low voltage cable systems. If the cable manufacture produces a cable with the proper ratings and is available with either interlocking or corrugated armor that will be selected. If the cable has no internal armor Plenum innerduct will be used to protect the Fiber in the cable tray within the building.

2. Contractor shall furnish and install a properly sized fiber housing to protect and house all terminated ends. Contractor shall take great care to follow manufacture's instruction on cable preparations, maintaining proper bend radii, and ensuring cable will not be pinched or pulled if housing has sliding trays or doors. WCT shall be Contacted "email here" before placement of housings in rack locations. Contractor shall furnish and install LC coupler panels that work with the fiber housing. All strands of fiber inside the fiber housing will be the proper working size of 900um if 250 um strands are present in the housing, they will be completely protected in a splice tray, fiber optic end faces will not be directly spliced on to any 250 um strands. Fan out kits will be used where needed.

- 3. In "unit 2 room" at 500 Justice drive there is an existing fiber housing make is Corning CCH-04. The housing is utilizing CORNING | CCH-CS24-A9-P00RE CCH Pigtailed Splice Cassette 24 F, LC UPC Duplex, Single-mode (OS2), Single-fiber (250 um the same part will be used in this fiber housing.
- 4. In the MER at The Humane Association there is an existing 19-inch rack where the fiber patch panel can be mounted, or a wooden back board can be attached to the wall for mounting of panel also. Contractor shall furnish the housing and wooden back board if needed.
- 5. Contractor shall furnish and install type LC connectors on all strands of fiber. Connectors shall only be fusion spliced on ends. Including but not limited to, preterminated pig-tail connectors, crassest housings with preterminated ends, directly splice on ends. No mechanic connectors will be accepted i.e., Corning UniCam connectors.
- 6. Contractor shall furnish and install a pull tape "Mule Tape" with a minimum rating of 5000 FT/LBS tensile strength and a trace wire along with the backbone cables between 500 justice drive and the 313 Humane Association.

Testing/Warranty

- 1. Testing will be Both Tier 1 and 2 for the fiber portion with results provided to Warren County Telecommunication. Test results shall be provided in an open standard electronic format such as PDF or XLSX.
- 2. Contractor will notify WCT Project Liaison Prior to Final testing. WCT reserves the right to be present during the testing phase of the project.
- 3. All testers will be properly referenced and calibrated within the last year.
- 4. All work will be completed to code, industry standards and industry best practices to include but not limited to EIA/TIA 568,569.570.606 and 607.

- 5. At a minimum a BICSI Technician®(TECHTM) will be present for all installation tasks. All fiber optic terminations will be performed by a technician having achieved at least a BICSI Installer 2, Optical Fiber® (INSTF®). The contractor will have a RCDD on staff to manage the project.
- 6. All work will carry a one-year warranty from the contactor to be free of defects. If defects are found with the warranty period, the contractor will fix the issues at no cost to the county.
- 7. Contractor will provide an engineered solution from the manufacture that carries a minimum of a 20-year warranty to be free from defects.

1. A Certified check, cashier's check, or letter of credit equal to five (5) percent of the bid. A letter of credit may only be revocable by the Owner. Upon entering into a contract with the Owner, the contractor must then file a performance bond for the amount of the contract and the bid guaranty will then be returned to the successful and unsuccessful bidders upon contract execution.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

Bids for Fiber Installation for 313 Cook Rd. Lebanon, OH 45036 Humane Association /Animal Shelter, Warren County Telecommunications will be received by the Owner at the Office of the Warren County Board of Commissioners, 406 Justice Drive, Lebanon, Ohio 45036, until 9:00 a.m., July 12th, 2022, and then at said office publicly opened and read aloud. Bids shall be submitted in a sealed envelope.

BIDDER: To ensure acceptance of your bid, please follow these instructions:

- 1. **APPLICABLE LAWS:** The Ohio Revised Code and resolutions and procedures of Warren County, insofar as they apply to the laws of competitive bidding contracts and purchases, are made a part hereof. All laws of the United State of America, the State of Ohio, and the County of Warren applicable to the products or services covered herein, are made a part hereof.
- 2. **PRICING**: Prices should be stated in units of quantity specified in the bid document. In case of a discrepancy in computing the amount of the bid, unit prices quoted shall govern.
- 3. <u>**DELIVERY**:</u> Quotations should include all charges for delivery, packing, crating, containers, etc. Prices quoted will be considered as being based on delivery.
- 4. **SPECIFICATIONS/DESCRIPTIONS:** References to a particular trade name, manufacturer's catalog, or model number, are made for descriptive purposes to guide the bidder in interpreting the requirements of the County. They should not be construed as excluding proposals on other types of materials, equipment, and supplies. However, the bidder, if awarded a contract, will be required to furnish the particular item referred to in the specifications or description unless a departure or substitution is clearly noted and described in the proposal.
- 5. **TAXES:** The County is generally exempt from Federal Excise Tax and State Sales Tax.
- 6. **BID INFORMALITIES, REJECTION AND AWARD:** The County reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any irregularities in a bid, or to accept the bid which in the judgment of proper officials is to be in the best interest of the County. The County reserves the right to accept a part or parts of a bid unless otherwise restricted in the bid.
- 7. **PAYMENTS:** Partial payments may be made upon presentation of a properly executed invoice unless otherwise stated in the bid document. The final payment will be made by the County when the materials, supplies, services, or equipment have been fully delivered and accepted or the work completed to the full satisfaction of the County.
- 8. **<u>BIDDERS SIGNATURE</u>**: Each proposal price (bid) sheet must be signed by the bidder with his usual signature. All signatures should be in full. Bids by partnership should

include the names of the partners composing the partnership and must be signed by one or more of the partners in the following manner "John James Smith, D.B.A., Smith-James Company, by John James, a partner."

9. **SUBMISSION AND RECEIPT OF BIDS:**

- A. Bidders are requested to use the bid sheet proposal form furnished by the County.
- B. Exceptions to any bid specification must be clearly detailed on the exception sheet. The exception sheets must be completed and submitted attached to the bid sheet. If "none" is shown on the exception sheet, all items bid must be equal or superior to the original specifications.
- C. Proposals having any erasures or corrections thereon may be rejected unless explained or noted over the signature of the bidder.
- D. Bids shall be submitted in a sealed envelope clearly marked "Bid Opening Fiber Installation for 313 Cook Rd. Lebanon, OH 45036 Humane Association /Animal Shelter, Warren County Telecommunications, July 12th, 2022 @ 9:00 a.m.", and shall display the bidder's name and address in the upper left-hand corner of the envelope.
- 10. <u>Bid Contract/Purchase Agreement</u>: All bids must include a contract/purchase agreement, in accordance with The "Mandatory Contract Terms and Conditions". Bidder must submit 2 original copies signed in wet blue ink with their bid proposals. Signature line for Warren County must be addressed to Warren County board of Commissioners.
- 11. **LOCAL SERVICE:** Local service is to be provided by the successful bidder, if applicable. Service during the warranty period shall be at no cost to Warren County; to include all incidental costs such as travel, mileage, hauling, etc.
- 12. <u>PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX AFFIDAVIT:</u> All bidders must complete the personal property tax affidavit (Section C) and submit with bid. *This section should be fully completed whether or not you as a vendor/contractor own property in Warren County, Ohio.*
- 13. **EEO Requirements:** Please see Section E for requirements and Non-Discrimination and Equal Employment Opportunity Affidavit.
- 14. **BID GUARANTY:** A certified check, cashier's check, or letter of credit in the amount of five (5) percent of the bid or a bid bond in the amount of one hundred (100) percent of the total bid is required to accompany all bids. Form of a bid guaranty bond is attached (Attachment A).

- 15. **DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING SEALED BIDS:** Sealed bids must be received by the Clerk of the Warren County Board of Commissioners prior to 9:00 a.m. July 12, 2022. Bids shall be opened after that time. Warren County shall not accept responsibility for any delay in delivery of a bid.
- 16. **LENGTH OF BINDING QUOTATIONS:** All prices quoted in the bid proposal are binding for sixty (60) days from the date of opening.
- 17. WITHDRAWAL OF BID: A Bidder may withdraw his bid from consideration if the price bid was substantially lower than the other bids, provided the bid was submitted in good faith and the reason for the price being substantially lower was a clerical mistake as opposed to a judgment mistake and was actually due to an unintentional omission of a substantial quantity of work, labor or material made directly in the compilation of the bid. Request to withdraw such bid must be made in writing and filed with the Owner within two business days after the opening of bids and prior to the acceptance thereof. No bid may be withdrawn after it has been accepted by the Warren County Board of Commissioners.
- 18. **<u>DELAY IN DELIVERY:</u>** Any delay in delivery beyond the date stated on the bid proposal may result in liquidated damages of up to 5% at the County's discretion.
- 19. <u>ADVERTISEMENT:</u> An advertisement inviting bids for materials/services provided herein will appear in the Journal News Pulse on June 26th, 2022.
- 20. **PERFORMANCE BOND:** Upon acceptance of a bid, Warren County requires, as a condition to entering into a contract with the successful Bidder, faithful performance of all things to be done under the Contract and may require a performance bond as provided for under Ohio Revised Code, Section 307.89, with good and sufficient surety in an amount not to exceed the amount of the contract. (Form of Performance bond may be found under Ohio Revised Code, Section 153.57). Please note that upon execution of the Contract if a Bid Guaranty/Contract Bond was submitted with your original bid a Performance Bond is not required.
- 22. Failure to complete and submit all required documents and attachments supplied with and/or requested in these instructions can result in a bid being considered non-responsive.

SECTION C. MANDATORY CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Any contract entered pursuant to this invitation to bid shall include but not be limited to the following contract terms:

Indemnification and Liability. The successful proposer shall agree to indemnify and hold harmless the County, and its officers and employees, from and against all liability, claims, demands, and expenses, including court costs and attorney fees, on account of any injury, loss, or damage, which arises out of the work to be performed under this Agreement, if such injury, loss, or damage is due to the negligence of the respondent, any subcontractor of the respondent, or any officer, employee, or agent of the respondent. Warren County shall not indemnify the successful proposer, rather the successful proposer shall be liable for the negligent act or omissions, intention or wrongful acts or omissions, by or through itself, its employees and agents. The successful proposer shall agree to defend itself and themselves and pay any judgments and costs arising out of such negligent, intentional or wrongful acts or omissions, and nothing in the Agreement shall impute or transfer any such liability from the proposer to Warren County.

Warranty. The selected proposer shall warrant that the fiber installation will conform to the requirements and specifications as stated in this invitation to bid. That is, the detailed requirements as stated in this invitation to bid will become part of the selected proposer's contract and will be warranted as such. The selected respondent must warrant that the content of its proposal accurately reflects the capability to satisfy the functional requirements as included in this invitation to bid. Furthermore, the warranty, at a minimum, shall be valid for a period of 24 months from the acceptance of the software.

Controlling Law and Venue. This Invitation to Bid and any resultant contract shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of the State of Ohio. Any legal disputes resulting from this invitation to bid or the activities under any contract awarded resulting therefrom shall take place in the Warren County Court of Common Pleas, Lebanon, Ohio.

Legal Disputes. Any legal dispute concerning the Invitation to Bid or resultant contract shall be resolved by litigation. However, the parties may agree upon mediation to be conducted by a mediator agreed upon by the parties or a court appointed mediator.

Fiber Specifications

- 1. The contractor shall furnish and install a 24-strand single-mode fiber optical cable from the 500 Justice DR. building in the "Unit 2 room" in the designated rack space on Warren County Government Campus to the Humane Association MER. The fiber optic cable shall be suitable and carry the proper rating and protection for installation in an outdoor and/or underground conduit environment. The cable shall be loose tube and follow the industry-standard color code.
- 2. The contractor shall furnish and install a 24-strand fiber underground in orange innerduct from 500 Justice Dr Unit 2 frame room to 313 Cook Rd Humane Association MER.
 - Contractor shall provide and furnish a cable with the proper rating to be installed in an outdoor environment enclosed in a conduit. Simultaneously carrying the proper rating to be installed in a plenum environment. The cable shall have suitable protection from the manufacture to keep the cable protected underground enclosed in conduit and in an overhead tray with a variety of other low voltage cable systems. If the cable manufacture produces a cable with the proper ratings and is available with either interlocking or corrugated armor that will be selected. If the cable has no internal armor Plenum innerduct will be used to protect the Fiber in the cable tray within the building.
- 3. Contractor shall furnish and install a properly sized fiber housing to protect and house all terminated ends. - 5. In the MER at The Humane Association there is an existing 19-inch rack where the fiber patch panel can be mounted, or a wooden back board can be attached to the wall for mounting of panel also. Contractor shall furnish the housing and wooden back board if needed.

- 6. Contractor shall furnish and install type LC connectors on all strands of fiber. Connectors shall only be fusion spliced on ends. Including but not limited to, pre-terminated pig-tail connectors, crassest housings with pre-terminated ends, directly splice on ends.
