## **WARREN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS APPOINTS PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT FOR 2023**

WARREN COUNTY, OHIO – Today the Warren County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) held its annual organizational meeting. As the first meeting of the year, the Board appointed Commissioner Shannon Jones to serve as President and Commissioner Dave Young as Vice President. Commissioner Jones was first elected to the BOCC in November 2016, currently serving in her second term. Prior to her election, Commissioner Jones served in the Ohio General Assembly for over a decade and has served on numerous boards and committees spanning the local, state, and national levels. Commissioner Young is the senior-most board member, elected in 2004 and currently serving his fifth term. As a strong voice for conservative fiscal management, Commissioner Young consistently supports policies that facilitate limited government and prudent financial decisions on behalf of the taxpayer.

Additionally, Commissioner Tom Grossmann was sworn in this morning, beginning his third term, originally elected in 2014. Commissioner Grossmann has been active in local government for over two decades, previously serving three terms on Mason City Council, and as Mayor in 2007. As part of their organizational meeting, the BOCC set their regular public meetings to be held Tuesdays at 9:00 a.m. with an “as needed” meeting on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of every month at 5:00 p.m. and made various Board appointments and reappointments.
